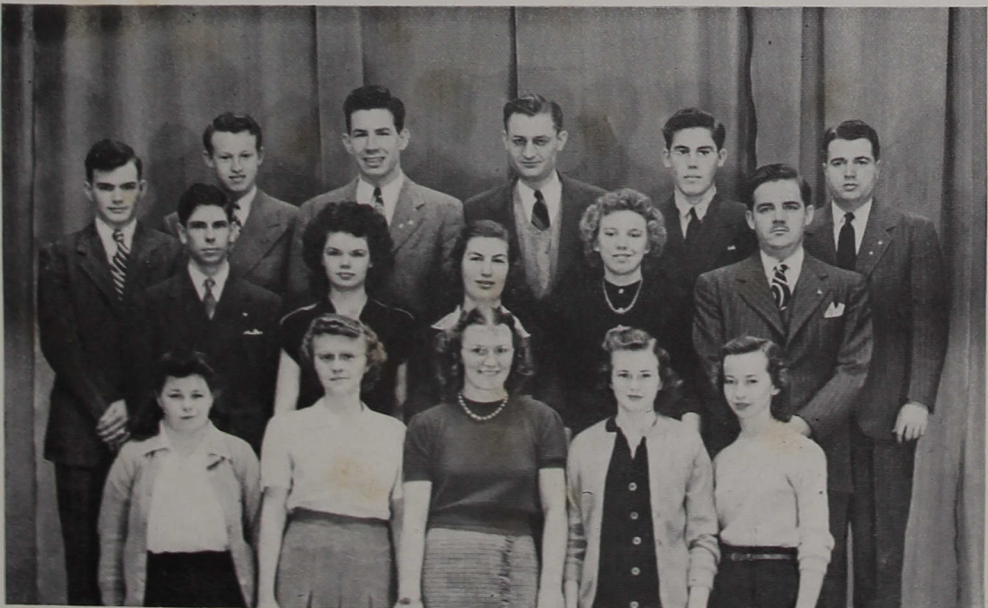
# Student Council

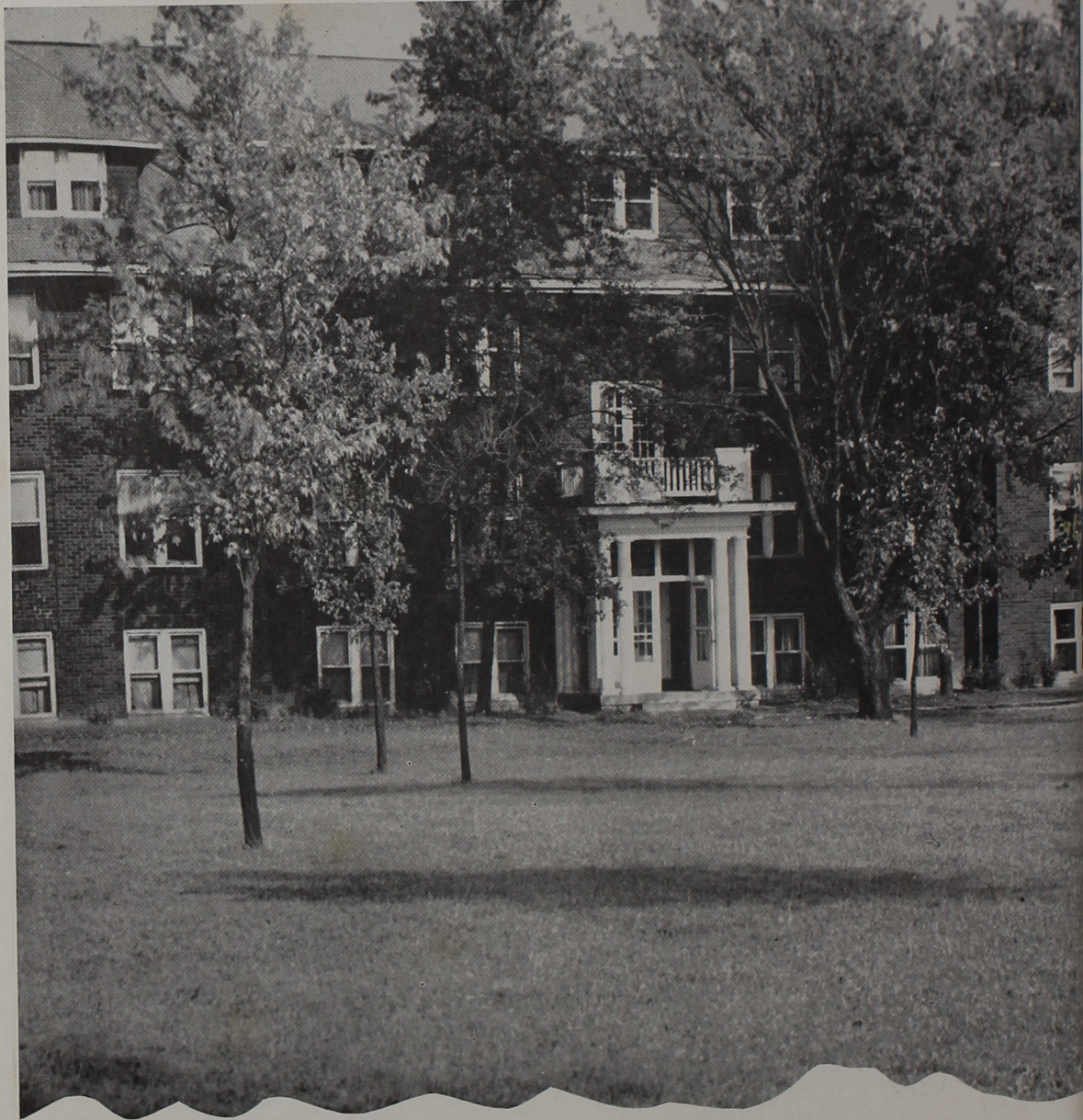
During its first year the Council has shown that it is an important part of campus life, and with the continued support of students and faculty it should contribute much to the future of Indiana Central College.

### Bogle Is M.C. At Banquet

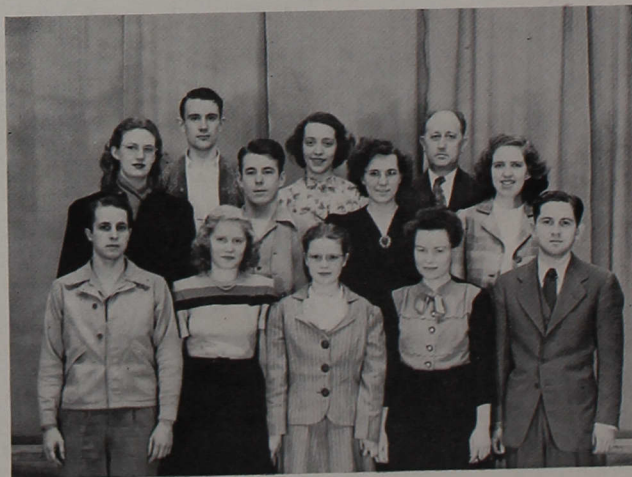
