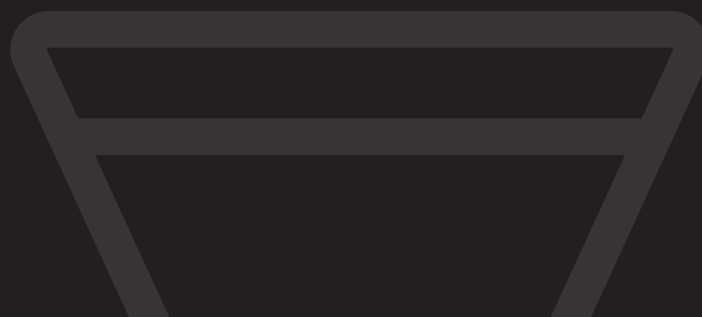

ADMISSION GUIDELINES

The first and most important areas UIIndy considers when evaluating prospective students for full-time admission are strength of academic preparation for college and high school grade point average. Other factors considered include class rank and test scores. At a minimum, students should rank in the top half of their class and earn an above-average grade point average and above-average standardized test scores.

Concurrent Students. Concurrent enrollment generally is offered to high school students who have completed their sophomore year in high school, rank in the top 25 percent of their class, and have written approval from their school. Enrollment is on a space-available basis at half the cost of the prevailing evening tuition rate. Seven credit hours per semester are allowed.

ADMISSION PROCEDURES

Admission Decisions. A decision is made on completion of a candidate's application file. A *tentative* admission decision is made for a high school senior based on a transcript that includes completion of at least the sixth semester of high school; a *final* decision is made based on the student's obtaining a high school diploma that meets federal guidelines for ability to benefit and upon receipt of a final high school transcript showing completion of all graduation requirements. Tests to Take. Students seeking regular or full-time admission are required to submit Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) **or** American College Test (ACT) scores. This requirement may be waived if the applicant has earned substantial credit or holds an earned degree from another regionally accredited institution. The test requirement is not in effect for students wishing to attend part-time. SAT or ACT writing scores submitted to UIIndy may be considered as a factor for undergraduate admissions. Applicants without writing scores may be required to submit writing scores if they do not meet standard admission guidelines.

Advance Tuition Deposit. A tuition deposit of \$100 is required of all candidates offered admission to the Day Division for the term beginning in August. The deposit is due in March for priority consideration

or two weeks after the offer of admission, whichever is later. Requests to defer the tuition deposit during this period should be made to the Admissions director. It is 100 percent refundable on written request until May 1 and 50 percent refundable on written request from May 2 to July 1, but 100 percent nonrefundable thereafter. A \$100 nonrefundable tuition deposit is required for January Day Division enrollment.

Health Form. Students admitted for nine hours or more for Day Division must have a medical record on file prior to initial enrollment. This medical form will be sent from the Office of Admissions.

Credit by Examination. Students may earn an unlimited number of hours by scoring satisfactorily in any of the following programs: the College Board **Advanced Placement Program** (AP), Educational Testing Service **College Level Examination Program** (CLEP), and American College Testing **Proficiency Examination Program** (PEP). Information is available from the Office of the Registrar, (317) 788-3219.

CAMPUS HOUSING

In the space provided on the application, candidates for Day Division enrollment should indicate a housing preference. Applicants who plan to live in a campus residence hall will receive housing deposit and contract information at the appropriate time. Note: some students are required to live on campus based on admission category.

Semester I housing deposits are due by March for priority consideration or two weeks after the offer of admission, whichever is later; refunds follow the tuition deposit schedule. Housing deposits for Semester II are due by December 1 or promptly on notification of admission, whichever is later. Semester II housing deposits are nonrefundable.

Residence hall and roommate preferences will be honored whenever possible, with consideration given to the order in which deposits and contracts are received. Usually, housing is available only to full-time students enrolled in the Day Division, although individual requests will be considered on a space-available basis.

For residence facility information, call the Office of Campus Life at (317) 788-3530. The University reserves the right to make all final decisions regarding residence hall assignments and to determine who may live in University-owned housing.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Some merit based scholarships are awarded automatically at the time of admission. Qualifying students will be notified of scholarship awards shortly after admission. Students majoring in certain academic programs may be considered for available departmental scholarships also.

FINANCIAL AID

Types of Aid. Several types of need-based financial aid, scholarships, grants, loans, and work opportunities are available from federal, state, and institutional sources.

Eligibility. Before an offer of financial assistance can be made, a student must be admitted to the University and meet specific criteria for each aid program.

Application Process. To apply for financial aid, a student should:

1. File the Free Application for Federal Student Aid. The FAFSA may be filed online at www.fafsa.gov and must be received by the processor on or before April 15. List the University of Indianapolis to receive a copy of the FAFSA (Code #001804).
2. File the University of Indianapolis Application for Financial Aid online at <https://uapp.uindy.edu>.
