## APPLICATION PROCESS

1. Make sure you have a completed 2011–12 FAFSA on file with the financial aid office. If you attended another university during the academic year but already have filed the FAFSA, make sure our federal school code (001804-00) is added on to your 2011–12 FAFSA. You can do so online at <http://fafsa.gov> if you have your PIN, or you can call 1-800-433-3243. If you did not file a FAFSA for 2011–12, then you need to do so in order to receive summer aid. If you are filing the FAFSA after June 30, 2012, you must complete a 2012–13 FAFSA.
2. Register for summer classes. If you are going to enroll in both summer sessions, be sure to register for both at the same time.
3. Complete and return this University Summer Aid Application to the Office of Financial Aid. In order to be considered for aid, you must be registered for classes before returning the University Summer Aid Application.
4. The financial aid office will send you an award letter. When you receive your award letter, your Federal Direct Stafford loan will already be approved. Unless we hear from you, we will assume that you want the loan amount as approved. If you do not want the loan, or want a lesser amount, contact the Office of Financial Aid immediately.

If you do not indicate that you are declining the Stafford loan, then we will submit it for guarantee. If you are a first-time Direct Stafford Loan borrower, you must sign a Federal Direct Stafford Subsidized and Unsubsidized Loan Master Promissory Note and you must complete Stafford Loan counseling. You can complete both these loan tasks online at <https://studentloans.gov>.

Once your Master Promissory Note and Entrance Counseling are completed, your loan will guarantee, and a disbursement will be sent to the University. If you have borrowed before from the Direct Loan program, then you will not need to do a new Master Promissory Note.

## FUNDS AVAILABLE

Types of aid available during the summer are the Federal Pell Grant (undergraduate students with remaining eligibility only), Federal Direct Stafford Loan, and Federal PLUS Loan. Stafford loan amounts will be based on your grade level, annual maximum, and need.

## ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible for need-based financial aid, you must meet the following eligibility requirements.

### *Citizenship*

You must be a U.S. citizen, national, or permanent resident (I-551 or Alien Registration Receipt Card I-151). Male students must be registered with the Selective Service to be eligible for federal aid.

### *Drug Conviction*

A student's eligibility for federal financial aid may be affected if the student has been convicted for the possession or sale of illegal drugs for an offense that occurred while receiving federal student aid.

### *Student Status*

You must be admitted to the University as a regular degree-seeking student and you must be enrolled as at least a half-time student. Half-time is defined as six hours for undergraduates (a total of six hours in either summer session) and 4.5 hours for most graduate students. In some instances, undergraduate students who are enrolled for fewer than six hours may be eligible for Federal Pell Grants.

Continuing students must maintain satisfactory academic progress and must not be in default on any federal loan or owe a refund of any federal grant.

Students pursuing a second undergraduate degree or in a graduate program are eligible for the Federal Direct Stafford Loan only.

## PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

### *Federal Pell Grant*

The Federal Pell Grant is a federal student aid program based on need. These grants range up to \$5,550 per year, depending on the eligibility and enrollment status of the applicant.

### *Federal Direct Stafford Student Loan*

The Direct Stafford Subsidized Loan has a fixed interest rate of 3.4% for undergraduates and 6.8% for graduates for the 2011–12 year. With the Direct Stafford Subsidized Loan, no principal or interest payments are due, nor does interest accrue, while the student is enrolled on at least a half-time basis.

To be eligible for the subsidized loan, a student must demonstrate financial need. Principal payments may be deferred for the borrower, and funds are interest-free while the student is in school. The maximum loan amount for undergraduates is \$3,500 for freshmen, \$4,500 for sophomores, and \$5,500 per year for juniors and seniors. Graduate students may borrow a maximum of \$8,500 per year if originated by June 30, 2012. After June 30, graduate students are no longer eligible for subsidized funds.

The Direct Stafford Unsubsidized Loan has a fixed interest rate of 6.8%. Unsubsidized Federal Direct Stafford Loans are available to students who do not demonstrate financial need for all or part of the subsidized loan. Like the subsidized loan, principal payments may be deferred for the borrower; however, interest payments must be made quarterly or capitalized until repayment begins. Subsidized and unsubsidized loan amounts combined cannot exceed the annual limits.

In addition, independent undergraduate students may borrow up to an additional \$6,000 per year for the first and second years and up to \$7,000 for the remaining years in the Extended Unsubsidized Direct Stafford Loan program. Graduate students may borrow up to an additional \$12,000 per year if originated by June 30, 2012. After June 30, graduate students will be eligible to borrow only unsubsidized funds and thus may borrow up to \$20,500 per year. This loan in combination with other financial aid may not exceed the cost of education.

*Please note:* Borrowing for a summer enrollment period may have an impact on eligibility for the subsequent fall semester.

### *Federal PLUS Loan*

Parents of dependent students and graduate students may borrow up to the cost of education minus other aid. The interest rate of a PLUS loan is fixed at 7.9%. Repayment for parents begins within 60 days of disbursement unless the parents request to defer repayment within the PLUS loan application. Repayment for graduate students can be deferred until after graduation.

Applicants can apply at <https://studentloans.gov>. However, since most students can get tuition covered in the summer with Stafford loans, it is better to not apply for a PLUS loan until after the summer award letter is received.
