We have completed the initial review of your 2016-17 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Homeless means lacking fixed, regular, and adequate housing, which includes living in shelters, motels, or cars, or temporarily living with other people because you had nowhere else to go. **Unaccompanied** means you are not living in the physical custody of your parent(s) or guardian(s). **Youth** means you are 21 years of age or younger or you are still enrolled in high school as of the day you sign your FAFSA.

To confirm your status as one of the following:

This means that, after July 1, 2015, you are living in a homeless situation, as defined by Section 725 of the McKinney-Vento Act, and are not in the physical custody of a parent or guardian.

— **you are an unaccompanied, self-supporting youth at risk of homelessness.**

This means that, after July 1, 2015, you are not in the physical custody of a parent or guardian, you provide for your own living expenses entirely on your own, and are at risk of losing your housing.

MORE INFORMATION ABOUT HOMELESS AND UNACCOMPANIED YOUTH

Who are Unaccompanied Homeless Youth?

Unaccompanied homeless children are young individuals who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence who typically are not in the care of a parent or guardian. These young individuals may have run away from home or been forced to leave by their parents. Unaccompanied youth live in a variety of temporary situations, including shelters; the homes of friends or relatives (sharing the housing of other persons); or motels, hotels, trailer parks, camping grounds, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, or bus or train stations. Unaccompanied youth do not receive financial support from their parent(s) and do not have access to parental information. For more information, visit: center.serve.org/nche. Who are McKinney-Vento School District Liaisons?

Under subtitle VII-B of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act, every school district is required to appoint a liaison who serves as one of the primary contacts between homeless families and school staff, district personnel, shelter workers, and other service providers. The liaison coordinates services to ensure that homeless children and youth enroll in school and have the opportunity to succeed academically. Liaisons have a number of legal responsibilities under the Act, including identifying youth who meet the definition of homeless and unaccompanied. The education subtitle of the McKinney-Vento Act is overseen by the U.S. Department of Education. For more information, visit:

Services include the Basic Center Programs, Transitional Living Programs, Maternity Group Home Programs for Pregnant and Parenting Youth, and Street Outreach Programs that serve runaway and other unaccompanied homeless youth.
