- Academic period covered by awards: May 11, 2009, to August 14, 2009.
- You must register for your summer classes before this application can be submitted to the Office of Financial Aid.
- You must notify the Financial Aid Office of changes in the number of credit hours you will take and/or changes in housing status prior to the first day of the summer.

Application Process

1. Make sure you have a completed 2008–2009 FAFSA on file with the financial aid office. If you attended another university during the academic year, but already filed a FAFSA, make sure our federal school code (001804-00) is added on to your 2008–2009 FAFSA. You can do so by going online at <http://fafsa.ed.gov> if you have your PIN, or you can call 1-800-433-3243. If you did not file a FAFSA for 2008–2009, then you need to do so in order to receive summer aid. If you are filing the FAFSA after June 30, 2009, then you will need to complete a 2009–2010 FAFSA (and will be considered only for Federal Stafford loan money).
2. Register for summer classes. If you are going to enroll in both summer sessions, be sure to register for both at the same time. If you are an accelerated student, then you must take at least one course each session (three total).
3. Complete and return the University Summer Aid Application to the Office of Financial Aid.
4. The financial aid office will send you an award letter. When you receive your award letter, we will have already approved your Federal Stafford loan. Unless we hear from you, we will assume that you want the loan amount we have approved. If you do not want the loan, or want a lesser amount, then you will need to contact the Office of Financial Aid immediately. Also, we will process the loan using USA Funds as the guaranty agency. If you prefer to use a different guaranty agency (i.e. Great Lakes, TG), then you would need to let us know that as well.

If you do not indicate that you are declining the Stafford loan, then we will submit it for guarantee. If you are a new borrower, you will then be contacted to complete a Master Promissory Note with the lender of your choice. You can complete a Master Promissory Note online (<http://financialaid.uindy.edu>). You will be given our preferred lender list and the option to choose one of these lenders, or you can opt to choose another lender if you do not want to use one of our preferred lenders.

Once your Master Promissory Note and Entrance Counseling are completed, your loan will guarantee, and a disbursement will be sent to the University for each semester. If you have borrowed before, then you will not need to do a new Master Promissory.

Funds Available

The two types of aid available during the summer are the Federal Pell Grant and the Federal Stafford Loan. If you received Pell Grant money during the academic year (either here or at another school), you will be eligible to receive only any unused portion. Stafford loan amount will be based on your grade level, annual maximum, and need.

Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for need-based financial aid, you must meet the following eligibility requirements.

Citizenship

You must be a U.S. citizen, national, or permanent resident (Alien Registration Receipt Card I-151 or I-551). Male students must be registered with the Selective Service to be eligible for federal aid.

Student Status

You must be admitted to the University as a regular degree-seeking student and must be enrolled as at least a half-time student. Half-time is defined as six hours for undergraduates (three hours in **each** summer session or six

hours in either summer session) and 4.5 hours for graduate students. In some instances, students who are enrolled for fewer than six hours may be eligible for Federal Pell Grants. Continuing students must maintain satisfactory academic progress and must not be in default on any federal loan or owe a refund of any federal grant.

Students pursuing a second undergraduate degree, teaching certificate (having already received an undergraduate degree), or graduate program are eligible for the Federal Stafford Loan only.

Program Description

Federal Pell Grant

The Federal Pell Grant is a federal student aid program that is based on need. These grants range up to \$4,731 per year, depending on the eligibility and enrollment status of the applicant.

Federal Stafford Student Loan

The Stafford Subsidized Loan has a fixed interest rate of 6%. Students who have borrowed before will maintain the interest rates of their original loan. For the Stafford Subsidized Loan, no principal or interest payments are due, nor does interest accrue while the student is enrolled on at least a half-time basis.

To be eligible for the subsidized loan, a student must demonstrate financial need. Principal payments may be deferred for the borrower, and funds are interest-free while the student is in school. The maximum loan amount for undergraduates is \$3,500 for freshmen, \$4,500 for sophomores, and \$5,500 per year for juniors and seniors. Graduate students may borrow a maximum of \$8,500 per year.

Unsubsidized Federal Stafford Loans are available to students who do not demonstrate financial need for all or part of the subsidized loan. Like the subsidized loan, principal payments may be deferred for the borrower; however, interest payments must be made quarterly or capitalized until repayment begins. Loan limits and interest rates are the same as the Federal Stafford Subsidized Loan Program. Subsidized and unsubsidized loan amounts combined cannot exceed the annual limits.

In addition, independent undergraduate students may borrow up to an additional \$4,000 per year for the first and second years and up to \$5,000 for the remaining years in the Extended Unsubsidized Stafford Loan program. Graduate students may borrow up to an additional \$12,000 per year. This loan in combination with other financial aid may not exceed the cost of education.

Please note: Borrowing for a summer enrollment period may have an impact on eligibility for the subsequent fall semester.

Federal Parent Loan

Through participating lenders, parents of dependent students and graduate students may borrow up to the cost of education minus other aid. The interest rate of a PLUS loan is fixed at 8.5%. Repayment for the parent begins within 60 days of disbursement. Repayment for graduate students can be deferred until after graduation.

Applicants can apply online at <http://financialaid.uindy.edu>. However, since most students can get tuition covered in the summer with Stafford loans, it is better to not apply for a PLUS loan until after the summer award letter is received.
