This volume rounds out the selected remaining papers from the two International Symposia on Families: East and West and invited papers that have been designated for classroom use by the authors. In a rapidly changing world where ideas, information, commodities and people are in constant motion, and as the world market model sets the trend of economic development, the global village concept correctly describes the human social structure. Cultural conflicts in social relocation and economic changes are some of the problems families face and for which they can share solutions. The 25 articles are written by researchers and educators in sociology, political science, psychology, education, anthropology, social work, and family life practitioners in both the East and the West. The book is grouped into eight parts: Marriage and Family in Global Perspective; Gender Roles; Family Relationships; Household Division of Labor; The elderly; Family Crisis; Family and Social Change; and Social Interventions on Family.
