







The queen for the Road Race was Judy Toction, who was crowned by President Esch in pre-race ceremonies.



The joy was short-lived, however, as the Greyhounds lost to a fine Manchester team the following week. 


I. C. C. Invades Brown County





The meal consists of special meat, usually sirloin steak, a special birthday cake with candles, and ice cream, besides the usual vegetables and salads. 

Indiana Central enjoyed another prosperous basketball season with a veteran squad under the direction of Coach Nicoson.




Wrestlers

With the hope that wrestling will soon become a conference sport, the team and many fans will anxiously be awaiting the action of another fine season next year.







"C" and Booster Clubs



Leap Week Means Turn-About


