****NOTE:** All APHE majors must pass KINS 260, KINS 236, and BIOL 203 (or BIOL 204 or CHEM 150) with a grade of C or better to move forward into 300-level and above public health courses.

Electives

Elective courses are chosen in consultation with an academic advisor. The elective component can be fulfilled by any college-level course offered at the University of Indianapolis or accepted in transfer from an accredited college or university. Students may use these elective hours to complete additional majors, minors, concentrations or certificate programs.

Notes

1. Multiple courses have prerequisites. Students are responsible for knowing and fulfilling the requirements for course prerequisites for graduation. These requirements are listed in the Academic Catalog.
2. BIOL 203 also meets the Natural Science requirement in the General Education Core
3. KINS 101 also meets the Wellness requirement in the General Education Core.
4. SOC 250 also meets the Social Science requirement in the General Education Core.
5. KINS 260 also meets the Global Awareness and Experiencing Cultural Differences requirement in the General Education Core.
6. KINS 495 also meets the Capstone requirement in the General Education Core. Students must complete all other major coursework prior to taking.
7. GERO 301 also meets the Global Awareness and Experiencing Cultural Differences requirement in the General Education Core.
8. KINS 465 also meets the Global Awareness and Experiencing Global Awareness requirement in the General Education Core.
9. The Bachelor of Science in Public Health Education and Promotion requires a minimum of 120 credit hours.
10. Adult Accelerated Programs students must satisfy the General Education Core requirements with exceptions. SCAS 101 fulfills the FYS and NSE requirement. Lecture/Performance and Spring Term are not required.
11. A grade of C (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) or higher is required in all courses applying toward the Public Health Education and Promotion major.
12. Student must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher in all accelerated courses to remain in good standing in the accelerated program.
