A portfolio submission and interview or audition is required before admission into all Music Industry programs

\*Passing the Theory Proficiency Exam or Music Fundamentals with a C minimum is prerequisite to **MUS 132 and 133**.

**LESSONS**

All music majors in the Music Industry program will be required to enroll in a minimum of one hour of applied lessons in their major instrument *or* an instrument class (class voice, class guitar) for a minimum of two semesters. A Music Industry-specific section of Performances Disciplines (MUS 150) is required each semester.

### **ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS and NOTES:**

- A grade of C (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) or higher is required in all courses applying toward the Music Industry Major.
- Minimum Concert Experience is required for Upper Divisional and prior to Graduation. (See Music Handbook).
- An Upper Divisional must be completed in order to register for 300/400 level music classes. (See Music Handbook)
- The Music Industry major with a Music Technology and Recording track requires 82-86 hours, 10 of which are Gen Ed equivalent, with approximately 34 additional Gen Ed hours.
- The Bachelor of Science degree require a minimum of 120 hours.

- A student may complete more than one major as long as each major has at least 24 discrete hours. Please see the Academic Catalog for additional details.
