2025-2026 Curriculum Guide for Bachelor of Science in Nursing (NUB) Bachelor of Science in Nursing

Nursing courses are arranged in a sequential fashion. Each student should consult with their advisor or the Academic Catalog for specific course prerequisites. Admission to nursing courses is competitive based on available clinical places, cumulative G.P.A, and the HESI Entrance Exam. Students must earn C's (2.0) in all required science, social sciences, psychology, and math courses. A minimum of a 2.80 cumulative G.P.A. is required to be considered for admission to the clinical portion of the program. Students who have withdrawn from or received a grade of C- or lower in more than two prerequisite science or math classes are ineligible to pursue the nursing curriculum.
