NOTE: A grade of C+ (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) or higher is required in all nursing (NURB) courses applying toward the Bachelor of Science in Nursing.

The Bachelor of Science in Nursing Degree requires a minimum of 120 hours. Achievement of these hours may also include several elective courses.

This program may require attendance in both day and extended programs classes.
