Students majoring in Psychology and planning to apply for early admission to the graduate Physical Therapy program must complete the requirements for the Psychology major, the General Education Core requirements, and the Pre-Physical Therapy requirements during the first three years of study. Completion of these sets of requirements will take careful planning; therefore, you should consult with your academic advisor on a regular basis. The following is a *suggested* three-year plan.

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NOTE: A grade of C- (1.7 on a 4.0 scale) or higher is required in all courses applying toward the Psychology Major. **NOTE:** For program prerequisites, the UIndy DPT program does not accept grades below a C. The UIndy DPT Program accepts Advanced Placement (AP) coursework to meet prerequisite requirements if they were approved by UIndy and appear on the official transcript. Courses taken on a pass-fail basis or any non-credit courses (except AP) will not count toward the prerequisite GPA.

NOTE: The Bachelor of Arts and Science Degree requires a minimum of 120 hours.

A student may complete more than one major as long as each major has at least 24 discrete hours. Please see the Academic Catalog for additional details.

Additional Notes:

- 1. Students may take general education courses any semester or during the summer.
- 2. If a student requires remediation in English or mathematics, he/she must attend summer school in order to complete requirements in three years.
- 3. Students must complete 94 undergraduate hours prior to enrollment in the graduate Physical Therapy program. See prerequisites for admission to University of Indianapolis Graduate Physical Therapy Program. Some of these courses fulfill general education requirements.
- 4. KINS 410: Biomechanics (3) is recommended for PPT, but not required.
- 5. Students must fulfill all general education and major requirements prior to enrollment in the graduate program in Physical Therapy.
- 6. If the student is admitted to the graduate program following his/her junior year, he/she will receive a BS degree in Psychology upon successful completion of the first year of the graduate program.
