**2025-2026 Curriculum Guide for Sociology Majors (SOC)**  
 Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science

Consult with your academic advisor each semester and refer to the Academic Catalog for specific course prerequisites, descriptions of electives, and when courses are typically offered.

**Required Courses:** All SOC majors must take the following sociology fundamentals (18 credit hours) and 6 credit hours of experiential sociology.

Students in the general sociology degree also choose 9 credits of social inequality electives for a total of 33 credit hours.

Students in the social research concentration also take 6 credit hours of social inequality electives and the research concentration courses (10 credit hours) for a total of 40 credit hours. One of the experiential courses must be a research focused practicum.

**Social Inequality (Choose at least three - 9 credit hours minimum)**

- SOC **200** The Family: A Global Perspective (3) (Semester I and II)

- SOC **235** Environmental Sociology (3) (Every other Semester I)
- SOC **245** Pop Culture and Social Change (3) (on sufficient demand)
- SOC **250** Gender Issues in Law and Society (3) (Semester I and II)
- SOC **270** Sociology of Health and Medicine (3)
- SOC **315** Cities and Communities (3) (Semester I)
- Other classes approved by department

**Experiential Sociology (6 credit hours)**

- SOC **440** Senior Seminar in Sociology I (3) (Semester I) \*\*

**AND choose at least three credit hours of the below**

- SOC **104** Social Problems Service Learning Lab (1)
- SOC **150** Community Learning and Serving (3)
- SOC **236** Service Learning in Sustainability (1-3)
- SOC **350** Practicum (1-6)
- Other classes approved by department

**Social Research Concentration (SRES):** students pursuing a BA in sociology with a social research concentration must take all required Sociological Fundamentals (18 hours), Social Inequality (6 credit hours), and Experiential Sociology courses (6 credit hours, at least 3 credit hours of which are a research practicum) plus

- **MATH 220** Elementary Statistics (4)
- **SOC 331** Quantitative Data Analysis (3)
- **SOC 332** Methods of Qualitative Research and Evaluation (3)

\* Students who major or minor in Sociology and major or minor in Psychology, Political Science, International Relations, or Communication may count PSY 124 and PSY 125, PSCI 301, or COMM 240 for the SOC 330 requirement. Sociology minors who meet the introductory research course requirement through another discipline will need to take a different sociology course. This is not the case for Sociology majors.

\*\* Seniors who are double majors should speak to the department chair about capstone opportunities.

\*\*\*At least 3 credits of a practicum that is research related must be taken.

**NOTES:**

- The Sociology major requires a minimum of 33 hours. A grade of C- (1.7 on a 4.0 scale) or higher is required in all courses applying toward the Sociology Major.
- The Bachelor of Arts Degree requires a minimum of 120 hours.

- A student may complete more than one major as long as each major has at least 24 discrete hours. Please see the Academic Catalog for additional details.
